I. The New 114th Congress

- A. Republicans are now the majority party in both the U. S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate and control all U.S. House and Senate committees.
- B. The leaders of the committees that have jurisdiction over our key issues are as follows:
 - U.S. House Energy and Commerce Chairman Rep. Fred Upton (R-MI) and Ranking Member Rep. Frank Pallone (D-NJ); House Commerce, Manufacturing, and Trade Subcommittee Chairman Rep. Mike Burgess, M.D. (R-TX), and Ranking Member Rep. Jan Schakowsky (D-IL);
 - 2. U.S. Senate Commerce, Science, and Transportation Committee Chairman John Thune (R-SD) and Ranking Member Bill Nelson (D-FL);
 - 3. U.S. Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Charles Grassley (R-IA) and Ranking Member Pat Leahy (D-VT); and
 - 4. U.S. Senate Finance Committee Chairman Orrin Hatch (R-UT) and Ranking Member Ron Wyden (D-OR).

- **A. Federal Medication Issue:** *Horseracing Integrity and Safety Act,* H.R. 2012 and S. 973)
- **B. Gaming bills:** Restoration of America's Wire Act, H.R. 4301 and S. 1406; Internet Gambling, Enforcement and Consumer Protection Act, H.R. 2282; Internet Poker Freedom Act, H.R. 3491
- **C. Tax issues** such as the 3-year depreciation of race horses that was extended retroactively for one year, but expired at the end of 2014
- D. Immigration reform
- **E.** Other issues, such as the *Prevent All Soring Tactics Act*, H. R. 1518 and S. 1406, could potentially provide a vehicle for amendments as they move through the legislative process
