"Regulators, Racetrack Vets and Compounded Substances: Perspectives of a New Mexico Veterinary Medical Board Member"

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Statement of Fact

Many incidents in New Mexico involving race track veterinarians using:

- compounded medications with illegal additives
- illegal medications
- illicit substances on horses at the race track

Case Review:

- abrupt search and seizure of compounded meds and controlled substances
- occurred at Ruidoso Downs Race Track in 2014



Case Background

- Sp 2014, horse tested positive for Viagra
 - Occurred @ Ruidoso Downs Race Track in NM
- Vet administering pre-race meds contacted by NMRC
 - Answered all questions
 - Voluntarily surrendered all meds administered
- NMRC tested meds, found Viagra in one compounded med
- Vet denied ordering med compounded with Viagra

- NMRC investigated and discovered Weatherford Pharmacy
 - Compounded the med containing Viagra
 - History of including unapproved substances to compounded medications dispensed
- Vet filed lawsuit against Weatherford Pharmacy
- NMRC investigator then felt a search and seizure was warranted due to incident and speculation about Weatherford pharmacy

2014 Search & Seizure Incident

- NMRC investigator and an assistant initiated search and seizure:
 - Occurred at Ruidoso Downs Race Track
 - Searched all of vet's vehicles
- Seized some of the compounded meds and one expired controlled substance
 - Taken to test for any illegal medications and/or illicit substances
- Concern: NMBVM aware of <u>some but not all</u> of the medications seized.

Medications Seized

- Medications seized from vets included:
 - Tildren
 - Ketamine expired bottle
 - Gastrogaurd compounded
 - Naquazone compounded
 - Desamethasone compounded
 - Bute compounded
- Current location NMRC office
- Status of testing -
 - unknown and info unavailable to NMBVM


Statement from NM BVM

- Recognizes need for stricter regulations of meds used in racing industry
- Agrees with/understands reason for search and seizure
- Disagrees with how search & seizure was conducted

ISSUES

- One or more reps of NM Pharmacy Board or DEA should have been present
- 2. Controlled drugs removed/transported by individuals without a DEA license.
- Current location of drugs in storage room at NMRC
 - Should be at Board of Pharmacy, not NMRC office
 - Vet are still accountable for controlled substance but it is no longer under the vet's control
- 4. Seizure caused significant financial loss to vets
- 5. NMBVM should have been notified by NMRC of situation prior to conducting search & seizure


5 Recommendations from NMBVM



- 1. Rep from NMBP or DEA should accompany any NMRC investigator when conducting a search and seizure.
- 2. NMRC to develop & implement written systematic procedure for search & seizure of meds.

- 3. Take photo and sample of med; label; leave original med with vet
- 4. If med bottle unlabeled, confiscate.
- 5. ED of NMBVM make arrangements for our investigator to accompany NMRC on all future search and seizure procedures.
