2012 Year Activity Review

2012 Financial Results -**Overall Comments**

- After years of running losses, we had a very good year
- Results reported today are based on "cash basis" of reporting
- Significant variations not expected in revision to "accrual basis"
- Audit has not been completed, results are tentative and preliminary

2012 Financial Results – National HBPA

- Budgeted 2012 LOSS of \$49,500
- Actual 2012 GAIN of \$34,500
- Bettered Budget by \$84,000
 - Conventions
 - Payroll Expense
 - Legal/Professional
 - Travel
 - Awards

2012 Financial Results – National Horsemen's' Administration Corporation

- Budgeted 2012 LOSS of \$13,000
- Actual 2012 GAIN of \$40,500
- Bettered Budget by \$53,500
 - Horseman's Journal turnaround

2012 Financial Results – Horseman's Journal

- Included within Admin Corp. (subset)
- 2012 Budgeted Loss of \$5,000
- 2012 Gain of \$40,900 National HBPA Administrative Corp Overview
- Bettered Budget by \$44,900
 - Advertising/Office Savings
 - Payroll Expense Savings
 - Printing/Professional Savings
 - Travel Savings

Texas Dues Appeal

- Texas, like many, under financial stress
- Assigned dues of \$16,000 based upon imputed survey data – they did not respond originally
- Texas did complete the newly developed and approved process
- Budget and Dues subcommittee review

Texas Dues Appeal

- Subcommittee and Budget and Dues Committee mutually concluded to reject the request of Texas but to take no position on whether or not Board should approve their request
- Unusual situation due to insurance
- Board will be confronted with a choice, based on wider economic considerations

Texas Dues Appeal – Bottom Line

- Texas will not pay more than \$5,000 in dues to remain in NHBPA in 2013
- Choice:
- Accept Texas Dues of \$5,000 or imperil rates for 2013 for others

Texas Dues Appeal – My Recommendation

- Accept Texas Dues of \$5,000 for 2013 due to issues relating to others
- Following summer convention, request Texas to shop their own insurance and to report findings to us
- Motion to follow

Texas Dues Appeal – Motion

- "I move that the Executive Committee recommend the following actions to be approved by the full board tomorrow:
 - Due to the circumstances discussed, for only the calendar year 2013, Texas be allowed to pay dues of \$5,000 and retain its membership within NHBPA; and
 - Following the Summer convention, Texas be requested to identify its options for self-coverage for its insurance needs and to report its findings to NHBPA"

2013 Budget and Dues Process BUDGET and DUES

- 2013 to have new approach,
 mandated by Board in prior years
- All-in-one dues figure; no separation of dues, industry initiative, legislative, and Horsemen's Journal
- Further, budgeted losses for entities could not be continued – <u>breakeven</u> <u>budget</u>

2013 Budget and Dues Process BUDGET

- October 2012 EC meeting, 2013 budget figure of \$522,250 presented
- Budget and Dues and staff reduced to \$489,250, approved by B&D
- Cuts to Groom Elite, \$15,000; Lobbyist \$12,000, Misc. charities and ROAP, \$6,000
- This is down from 2012 amount of \$530,250 equivalent in dues
 - 8.4% greater in 2012 than 2013 dues
 - 18.6% greater in 2012 w/ budgeted loss

2013 Budget and Dues Process BUDGET - Motion

"I move that the Executive Committee recommend for approval tomorrow by the full Board the budget approved by the Budget and Dues Committee, based upon total affiliate dues set at \$489,250 be accepted as the basis for management of the NHBPA entity in 2013."

2013 Budget and Dues Process DUES

- \$500,000 dues allocated on historical method per Joe Santanna
- Based upon administrative budget, race days, and non-stakes purses
- Amounts resulted in some adjustments for affiliates, generally most had dues reductions of some sort, few were increased

2013 Budget and Dues Process DUES

- \$500,000 is \$11,000 greater than budget, but was selected by B&D committee to reflect possible issues with affiliates known to be at risk (Texas and New Mexico) and modest collection risk
- Coincidental versus Texas amount
- Will seek approval at Board Meeting

2013 Budget and Dues Process DUES - Motion

- "I move that the Executive Committee recommend to the full Board for approval tomorrow the following:
 - The 2013 affiliate dues as presented to the affiliates in December 2012 be adopted as offered, but that
 - The 2013 dues for Texas be dropped to \$5,000
 - The shortfall from the resignation of New Mexico be addressed from 2012 earnings of the entity and not be passed on to other affiliates"
